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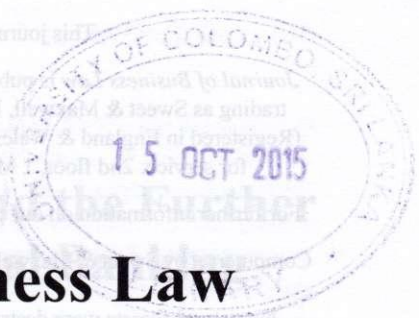
The Marcotte Trilogy and the Further Fragmentation of Federal Banking Powers in Canada
