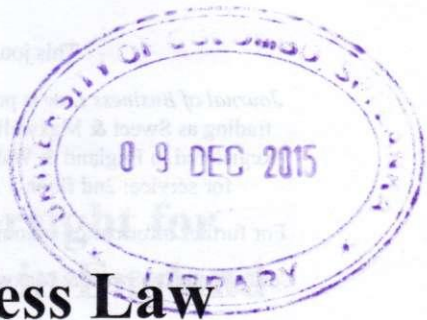
**Proposed Feasibility Oversight for Pre-pack Administration in England and Wales:

**The Omission of Personal Property Law from the Proposed Common European Sales
Law: The Hamlet Syndrome ... Without the Prince?**

James Devenney and Mel Kenny In 2011 the European Commission published a proposal for a Common European Sales Law (CESL). This proposal generated a huge amount of debate but the European Parliament endorsed the proposal, albeit in a revised form; limiting the CESL to distance contracts, particularly to online contracts. This paper critically reflects on the exclusion of property law from the ambit of the CESL. It considers the background to the CESL. In particular, it argues that this exclusion, whilst perhaps politically inevitable, creates fragmentation and knock-on problems in relation to interpretation/application. Moreover, it argues that, in contrast to the Commission's more optimistic view, the proposal risked missing an important opportunity in relation to consumer protection, as well as consumer confidence and disclosed a more fundamental weakness in the Commission's one-dimensional approach to "solving" complex problems in European contract law.
